## Preparing for Ofsted: SEND

Event Summary	In this course we will look at how to prepare for Ofsted if you are responsible for SEND or a member of Leadership in your school.
Event description	<p>'Everyone is a teacher of SEND.' This webinar is perfect for Sendcos and Leadership. It will help you identify what you should have in place in preparation for an Ofsted Inspection. ## Primary English: Developing Fluency in writing

Event Summary	As reported recently by Ofsted, fluent transcription skills are a building block for more complex writing challenges. In this webinar we explore ways in which teachers can ensure these foundations are firmly in place by the end of KS1.
Event description	<p>Recent reports from Ofsted (Ofsted English Report and Ofsted English Research Review) highlight the importance of fluent transcription skills as a building block for more complex writing challenges. During their inspections they often observe pupils' who are being expected to complete writing tasks without the skills needed to do so.</p> <p>In this webinar we explore a range of strategies and ideas aimed at putting the necessary foundations in place. This will include a focus on handwriting, spelling and sentence writing skills.</p> <p>Although primarily aimed at YR and KS1 this course may also be useful to those leading on English or who are supporting pupils who are working below age related expectations in writing in KS2.</p>

## SEND: Building emotional regulation skills in your pupils

Event Summary	In this two-hour webinar we will look at strategies to support pupils with their emotional regulation and resilience.
Event description	<p>The most recent State of the Nation report (February 2023) parents had reported children's emotional difficulties have worsened and have not returned to pre-pandemic levels. In addition, there has been an increase in the number of children identified with SEND, an increase in the number of permanent exclusions and suspensions and increased concerns around children regulating their emotions.</p> <p>In this webinar we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explore what is meant by emotional regulation?</li> <li>• Discuss the signs of emotional dysregulation and investigate how this might present in students with SEND</li> <li>• Identify strategies to support emotional regulation</li> <li>• Examine the importance of mindfulness to support emotional regulation</li> <li>• Investigate social and emotional learning in Primary schools</li> </ul>
Learning Outcomes	<p>Following this webinar, you will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Support your pupils who show signs of emotional dysregulation using a variety of strategies</li> <li>• Build your own skills when dealing with students who are unable to regulate their emotions</li> <li>• Implement social and emotional learning into your curriculum</li> </ul>
